Electronic Portfolios



What Will I Learn in Kindergarten & First Grade Art?

Primary colors: Red, Yellow, Blue


Secondary colors: Orange, Green, Violet **Neutral colors:** Black, White, Gray, Brown

Red + Yellow= Orange Yellow + Blue= Green Red + Blue= Violet

If I add **WHITE** to a color, it will become lighter. If I add **BLACK** to a color, it will become darker.







Neutral colors: Black, White, Gray, Brown


If I add WHITE to a color, it will become lighter.







What Will I Learn in Fourth & Fifth Grade Art?





Complementary= Two opposite colors on the color wheel




